


French:

Learning vocabulary and conversational skills relating to hobbies.



Computing:

We will be learning about coding and specific functions of 2Code.

Art:

We will look at Blitz artwork, particularly focusing on the artist Paul Nash and works by Henry Moore.

R.E:

We will question 'Is war ever just?'

PSHE:

Friends and family: The children will consider networks of people who are important to them. They will consider the value of diversity within friendships and understand there is a wide range of different family situations.

P.E:

Gym: Children will explore how they can employ symmetry and asymmetry into their floor work by working individually and in pairs. They will develop trust and confidence in their own ability.
Team Building Games: looking at the importance of working effectively by developing communication skills and leadership roles.

WW2

Children will spend the half term learning about WW2 and the impact on Britain. The children will investigate the poignant events throughout the war and how life in Britain changed during and after the end of the war.

Literacy:


Reading: We will read texts such as the *Diary of Anne Frank* and *Goodnight Mister Tom*, in order to create their own narrative pieces.

Writing: We will explore War Time poetry to develop the children's understanding of life during WW2. We will listen to broadcasts made by influential people throughout the war, which will be used as the basis for forming own opinions and creating own inspirational speeches.

Grammar: identifying different word classes, including adverbs and prepositions.

Spelling: continuing to practise common spellings and learning new spelling patterns.

Handwriting: continuing to develop a neat, fluent joined style.



History:

Children will learn about the events of WW2. They will be taught about the Battle of Britain, The Blitz and what it was like in Britain during this time.

Maths:

Practising our understanding of number and using efficient written and mental methods for all operations. The children will revise recalling their multiplication and division facts at speed and transferring these skills into real life situations. Other skills the children will practise:

- Decimals
- Fractions
- Percentages



Science:

Light: Children will find out about sources of light and exploring how light travels and reflects in order for us to see.

Music:

Children will learn about 1930s and 40s Swing and Big Band music and then try to create their own.
